MARITIME TRADE REVIEW 2014

1.0 COMPARISON OF CARGO THROUGHPUT 2014 AND 2013

Table 1 shows the summary of seaborne trade comparison between for 2013 and 2014.

Cargo throughput for 2014 decreased by 13.84% compared to 2013. Total import and export trade volume for 2014 decreased by 14.24% compared to 2013. Total transit/transshipment trade volume for 2014 decreased by 5.69% over 2013.

2.0 PORTS SHARE OF CARGO THROUGHPUT FOR 2014

Cargo throughput for the seaports of Ghana (i.e. Tema and Takoradi) for 2014 was about 18.60 million metric tons (mt). Cargo throughput for the Port of Tema was 12.2 million mt representing 76.4% of the total, whilst the Port of Takoradi recorded 3.8 million mt, representing 23.6% of the total seaborne trade.

Transit/Transshipment imports amounted to 779,855mt, whilst transit/transshipment exports recorded 25,499mt. Table 1 below shows the summary performance for the review period.

3.0 COMPARISON OF GHANA'S SEABORNE TRADE for 2014 AND 2013 PER CARGO TYPE

3.1 IMPORT TRADE

Total imports for 2014 was 10.8 million mt. This comprised 4.0 million mt of Liner cargo, 2.0 million mt of Break bulk, 2.8 million mt of Dry bulk cargo and 2.0 million mt of Liquid bulk imports.

In Table 3 below, it can be seen that imports for 2014 decreased by 14.91% over 2013. For the trade types, there was a decline in Liner imports by 17.37%. Break bulk imports decreased by 3.51%, Dry bulk imports increased by 7.53% and Liquid bulk imports also increased by 30.96%.

3.2 EXPORT TRADE

The total export trade volume for 2014 was 4.4 million mt. This represents 14.24% decrease below 2013. This was made up of 1.58 million mt of Liner items, 473,966 mt of Break bulk items, 2.29 million mt of Dry Bulk and 36,963 mt of Liquid Bulk.

4.0 PERFORMANCE IN LADEN CONTAINERS

Table 4 below shows the details of the performance in laden containers for 2014. Total Laden Containers for

imports and exports for 2014 was 490,828 TEUs. This represents a decrease of 11.99% compared to 2013.

Total import Laden Containers for 2014 was 376,166 TEUs; a 14.57% decrease compared to 2013. Total export Laden Containers for 2014 was 114,662 TEUs; representing a decline of 2.31% compared to 2013.

5.0 DIRECTION OF GHANA'S SEABORNE TRADE

5.1 Import Trade

Table 5 and Figure 1 below show that majority of Ghana's seaborne imports for the period 2014 came from the Far East range, representing about 36% of the total import trade. North Continent was next with 17% share of Ghana's import trade. Imports from Africa were 1,306,531 mt, a decrease of 1,636,410 mt (or 55.60%) over the previous year's figure of 2,942,941 mt. The major commodities imported from the Africa Range which experienced significant increases were Crude Oil, LPG and Petroleum Products. Liquid Bulk Imports from Africa showed a decrease of 653,275 mt (i.e. 41.7%) below the previous year's figure of 1,566,786 mt.

5.2 Export Trade

The 4.38 million mt of seaborne exports for 2014 went to various destinations in the world. Majority of these exports went to the Far East and the North Continent ranges. The Far East range received a total of 2,400,232 mt (i.e. 54.8% of total exports) whilst the North Continent range received a total of 738,845mt (or 16.9% of total exports). Table 6 below gives more details about the direction of Ghana's seaborne export trade for 2014.

6.0 TRANSIT TRADE AND TRANSSHIPMENT THROUGH THE SEAPORTS OF GHANA

Total Transit/Transshipment trade volume for 2014 shows a decrease of 5.7% compared to 2013. Total volume of transit/transshipment for 2014 was 805,354 metric tons (mt).

Transit/Transshipment Imports for 2014 amounted to 779,855 mt, a decrease of 4.59% compared to 2013.

Transshipment/Transit Exports recorded 25,499 mt in 2014, a decrease of 30.1% compared to 2013. Table 7 below shows the details of the transit/transshipment trade volumes for the review period.

7.0 TRANSIT TRADE PERFORMANCE FOR BURKINA FASO, MALI AND NIGER

Total transit volume for the three (3) landlocked countries of Burkina Faso, Mali and Niger amounted to 588,326 mt in 2014. This represents a decline of 17.3% compared to 2013. The transit trade comprises imports of 569,010 mt and exports of 19,316 mt for 2014.

Major transit trade commodities included Bagged Fertilizer, Processed Foods/ Beverages and Cashew nuts. Details are shown in Table 8.

8.0 SHIPPING LINE PERFORMANCE IN GHANA'S SEABORNE TRADE

8.1 Shipping Line Performance in the Containerized Trade

Forty One (41) Shipping Lines were involved in the containerized cargo trade which amounted to 487,823 TEUs for the review period Jan-Dec. 2014. The highest operators were Maersk Line, with 133,420 TEUs (27.35% of the container trade) and Mediterranean Shipping Company (MSC), with 56,059 TEUs (11.49%).

8.2 Performance of Shipping Lines per Volume of Shipment and Trade Type

A total of one hundred and twenty (120) Shipping Lines and Charterers participated in transporting the over 15.2 million mt of Ghana's seaborne cargo (import & export) through the Ports of Tema and Takoradi during Jan-Dec. 2014.

9.0 PERFORMANCE OF SHIPPING AGENTS IN GHANA SEABORNE TRADE

9.1 Shipping Agents' Performance in the Containerized Trade

Thirty one (31) Shipping Agents were involved in the containerized trade to and from Ghana. Together, they handled 490,827 TEUs for the review period Jan-Dec. 2014. The highest performing agencies were Maersk Ghana Ltd, with 132,897TEUs (27.08% of the containerized trade) and MSC, with 56,0591TEUs (11.42% of the containerized trade).

9.2 Performance of Shipping Agents per Volume of Shipment and Trade Type

Seventy Three (73) Shipping Agents handled over 15.2illion mt of seaborne trade (import & export) through the Ports of Tema and Takoradi during the period Jan-Dec. 2014.
